This is a list of Rod Cary's best ~ 20 small flowering shrubs.

- grow usually less than 1m high
- have interesting foliage
- have interesting flowers
- are wildlife-friendly
- may be perfumed
- will grow in most local soil
- suit local conditions
- are mostly local to our area
- are easily maintained
- may flower intermittently all year
- may be clipped as a low hedge
- may tolerate shade
- are usually available from our nursery
